The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state fiscal year **2017-2018** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2017**. The use of these funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

1. Juveniles who associate with other delinquent youth;
2. School Behavioral Problems;
3. Parents/Guardians who have difficulty providing adequate supervision;
4. Anson County Juvenile Court has seen an increase in juveniles under the age of 12

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

Peer Domain: Juveniles who associate with others involved in delinquent/criminal activity.

Individual Domain: Behavioral/Emotional (Mental Health) Needs.

Family Domain: Marginal and/or inadequate parenting and supervision skills and Family Conflict in the Home.

School Domain: Juveniles involved in the Juvenile Court System that have school behavior, attendance, and academic concerns.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
